Skill : Writing (self expression)Objective : To assess self expression.

Allotment of marks: Grammatical accuracy is not expected.

Marks	Criteria	
5	As per the given beginning, has mentioned proper middle and end for the story. Has mentioned minute details to develop story.	
4	Has a proper beginning, middle and end, but has not developed characters, dialogues.	
3	Has tried to develop story, lacking in proper arrangement of ideas.	
2	Complete sentence and related description but expression in 1-2 sentences.	
1	Has made an attempt to describe with reference to the given beginning. Lacking in proper meaning.	
0	Irrelevant writing without considering the beginning of the story.	

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Guidelines for teachers about oral questions. (Total Marks 10)

Oral Q. 1 : Read the following passage carefully. (5 Marks)

Skill : Reading

Objective: To assess the reading ability.

Instructions for the teacher:

The question aims at assessing the ability of the student to read with comprehension. Since this is an oral question, each student is to be dealt in independently. If the number of students in the class is big, the oral assessment may be spread over 4-5 days.

George Washington Carver was born in 1861. His family worked on a farm in America. He lost both his parents when he was still a baby.

Carver loved plants even as a child. He cared for them. He understood what the plants wanted, what was wrong with them. Soon, people around the farm began to call the young boy 'plant doctor'. He studied hard and became a scientist. Carver went to teach at the Tuskegee Institute in Alabama. He worked there all his life.

Allotment of marks for reading.

Marks	Criteria	
5	Reading of the entire passage with tone, intonation and expression. Second reading of the passage is permissible.	
4	Reading of some sentences with tone and intonation.	
3	Could read after making an effort and could comprehend. Silent reading and then reading aloud is acceptable.	
2	Could read without guidance but no sensible reading.	
1	Could read with help but could not comprehend.	
0	Did not show interest in reading. Couldn't read in spite of help offered.
