Guidelines for teachers about oral questions.

Oral Q. 1 : Read the following passage carefully. (5 Marks)

Skill : Reading.

Objective: To assess the reading ability.

Instructions for the teacher:

The question aims at assessing the ability of the student to read with comprehension. Since this is an oral question, each student is to be dealt independently. If the number of students in the class is big, the oral assessment may be spread over 4-5 days.

Chandri lives in a mountain village in the Garhwal Himalayas. She spends every afternoon collecting firewood in the forest and talking to an old ash tree on the mountain-side. Chandri and Grandma had often sat together under the old ash tree. That was before Grandma was swept away when the River Alaknanda flooded.

One day, as she sits under the tree and thinks of Grandma, Chandri hugs the tree and says, "You're my best friend."

Her thoughts are broken as she sees some dusty trucks slow down to a stop. They are filled with men carrying axes.

Chandri runs back to the village and straight to her mother. She tells her mother that men from the timber company have arrived with axes to cut down the trees.

Allotment of marks for reading:

Marks	Criteria
5	Reading of the entire passage with tone, intonation and expression. Second reading of the passage is permissible.
4	Reading of some sentences with tone and intonation.
3	Could read after making an effort and could comprehend. Silent reading and then reading aloud is acceptable.
2	Could read without guidance but no sensible reading.
1	Could read with help but could not comprehend.
0	Did not show interest in reading. Couldn't read inspite of help offered.
