Guidelines for teachers about written questions.

(Total Marks 40)

NOTE: Wherever necessary, teacher can explain the meaning of questions to the students in their respective language of instruction.

Q. 1) Skill : Listening.

Objective: To assess the ability of listening.

A) Listen the sounds and write what makes that sound.

(4 Marks)

Suggestion: Teacher will provide the following sounds with the given way.

1) clapping with the hands – clap-clap (1 Mark)

2) tapping at the door – knock-knock (1 Mark)

3) raindrops falling on the roof – pitter-patter (1 Mark)

4) rings the door-bell – ding-dong (1 Mark)

Allotment of marks: One mark for each correct word.

B) Listen the sentences and write down the names of colours.

(2 Marks)

Suggestion: Teacher reads the poem with proper pace. Asks the student to listen carefully and write the names of colours, which they listened in the poem.

Poem/Sentences:

Dark brown is the river,

Golden is the sand

I flows along for ever

with trees on either hand

Green leaves are floating

castles of the foam,

Boats of mine - a - boating

where will all come home?

Names of colours – brown, golden, green.

Allotment of marks: One mark each for any two names of colours.

C) Listen the sentences and write one and many for 2 animals. (2 Marks)

Suggestion: Teacher reads the given sentences and asks the student to listen carefully.

Then write down the pairs one-many of the prescribed 2 animals.

Sentences: The lion walks on paddled paws,

The squirrel leaps,

from limb to limb

While flies can crawl

straight up a wall

And seals can dire and swine.

Objective: To assess speaking skill.

Living things: plants, creature. (2 Mark)

Non-living things: stones, hills. (2 Mark)

Allotment of marks: Each correctly classified word carries 1 mark.

Oral Q. 1) : Listen and answer. (any 2)

(2 Marks)

Teacher should ask two questions to the student. He can add his own simple questions.

Instructions:

- 1) Where do you live?
- 2) Tell me your school address.
- 3) Which game do you like?
